The **YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID (MHFA)** course is designed to teach lay people methods of assisting a young person who may be in the early stages of developing a mental/behavioral health problem or in mental/behavioral health crisis. It contains information about mental health challenges and disorders in youth and young adults, incorporating the latest evidence on treatments and services available to them as relevant resources. This eight-hour training defines mental health challenges and mental disorders, distinguishes normal adolescence from mental health disorders and provides ways for dealing with a mental health crisis and significant emotional distress.

QPR is an emergency response to someone in suicide crisis. The program informs the attendees about the common causes and warning signs of suicidal behavior. This training also teaches individuals to effectively use the three-step method of “Question, Persuade and Refer to identify and interrupt a crisis while directing the person in need to the proper care. It offers hope through positive action and is not intended to be a form of counseling or treatment. **Attendees who complete the eight-hour training are certified as gate-keeper QPR instructors** and are permitted to lead a two-hour “QPR” training for schools and the community. We encourage schools to have at least one staff member QPR Instructor Trained so that he/she can offer the two-hour “gatekeeper” training for teachers/staff within the district as well as community.
